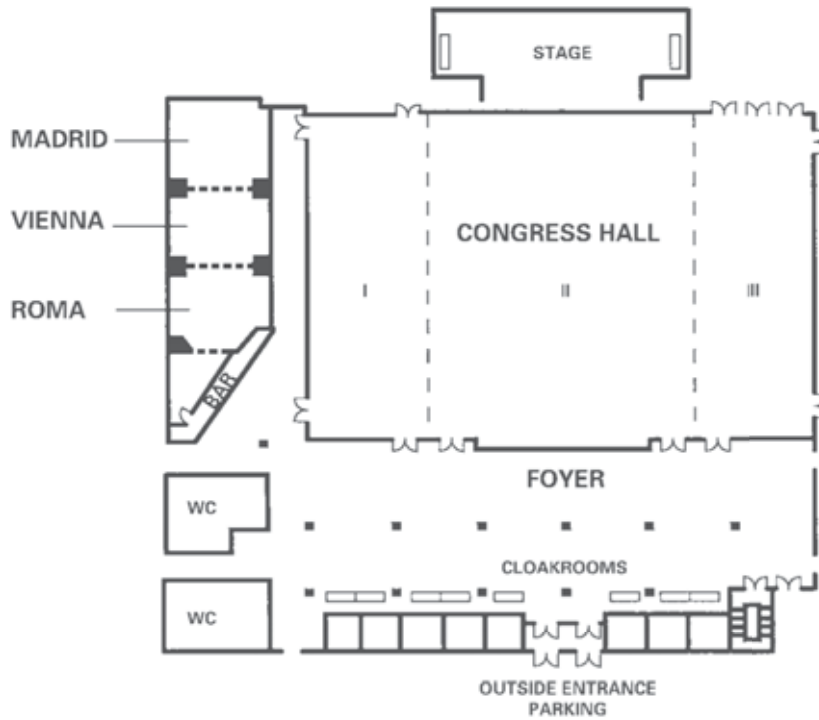
M — Mezzanine – Hilton Meetings, Grand Ballroom and Chez Louis

Israel is an epicenter for the major religions of the world and Ireland has a tremendous influx of immigrants. Self care was proposed to be important for nurses in both countries but for different reasons that relate to context. Findings from each country will be considered within the context of culture and contemporary dynamics occurring within each country. Findings will be contrasted to existing literature and how this study adds to what is known about self-care and burnout in both contexts. Qualitative results will review what the source of caring is, as perceived by nurses who hold a Christian world view. Quantitative results will examine to what extent nurses held to religious practices espoused by Christianity, such as tithing, attending Church, and praying. Finally, qualitative data will be examined at each end of the extremes for religious practices, to understand if the source and behaviors are different for nurses who adhere strictly to religious practices versus who do not practice Christianity in the strict sense.</p>

Such treatments are frequently disrupted by complications, whether infiltration or dislodgement of a peripheral line, thrombosis caused by a peripherally inserted central catheter, iatrogenic anemia associated with arterial line blood draws, or life threatening bloodstream infections associated with central venous or any vascular access device. The Intravascular Access Device Research Group at Griffith University is one of the leading groups in the world in undertaking research and leading evidence-based practice change in the area of vascular access. Led by Professor Claire Rickard, who has been researching in this area for 16 years, the group includes nurses, doctors, researchers, scientists, economists, microbiologists, and statisticians. Working with clinical specialists in cancer care, intensive care, emergency, infection control and infectious diseases, and the general medical and surgical areas, the group aims to make vascular access complications history.</p>

Developing an Interdisciplinary Behavioral Oncology Research Career

Victoria L. Champion, PhD, RN, FAAN

The career development of an interdisciplinary research scientist requires passion for a focused problem, a nationally recognized pre and post doctoral learning experience, senior mentorship, an interdisciplinary team, and most of all-persistence. This presentation will describe the development of my journey as a behavioral oncology research scientist whose career and whose focus includes 3 primary areas: 1) tailored interactive intervention programs to increase screening for both breast and colorectal cancer, 2) use of technology to develop and deliver interventions with the intent of increasing accessibility for underserved populations, and 3) cancer survivorship which includes the study of symptoms and symptom burden in cancer survivors. My studies have been supported continuously during this time from both the National Institutes of Health and the American Cancer Society. Much of my success is due to the advice and help I have received from others. Peer review and critique are essential to all success. I consider dissemination an essential component of research and have published in nursing, medical, and behavioral medicine journals with most of my publications published in interdisciplinary journals. Throughout my research career, I have mentored all levels of students and faculty, many whom have gone on to get multiple R01s. My mentoring activities led to the development of our Cancer Prevention and Control program at the National Cancer Institute designated cancer center-Indiana University Simon Cancer Center. Additionally, I founded the Behavioral Cooperative Oncology Group, a collaborative organization of behavioral oncology scientists from Indiana University, the University of Michigan, Michigan State University, and The Ohio State University. My ultimate goal is to share my knowledge and experience with others so my work and the work of those scientists upon whom I built continue to advance.

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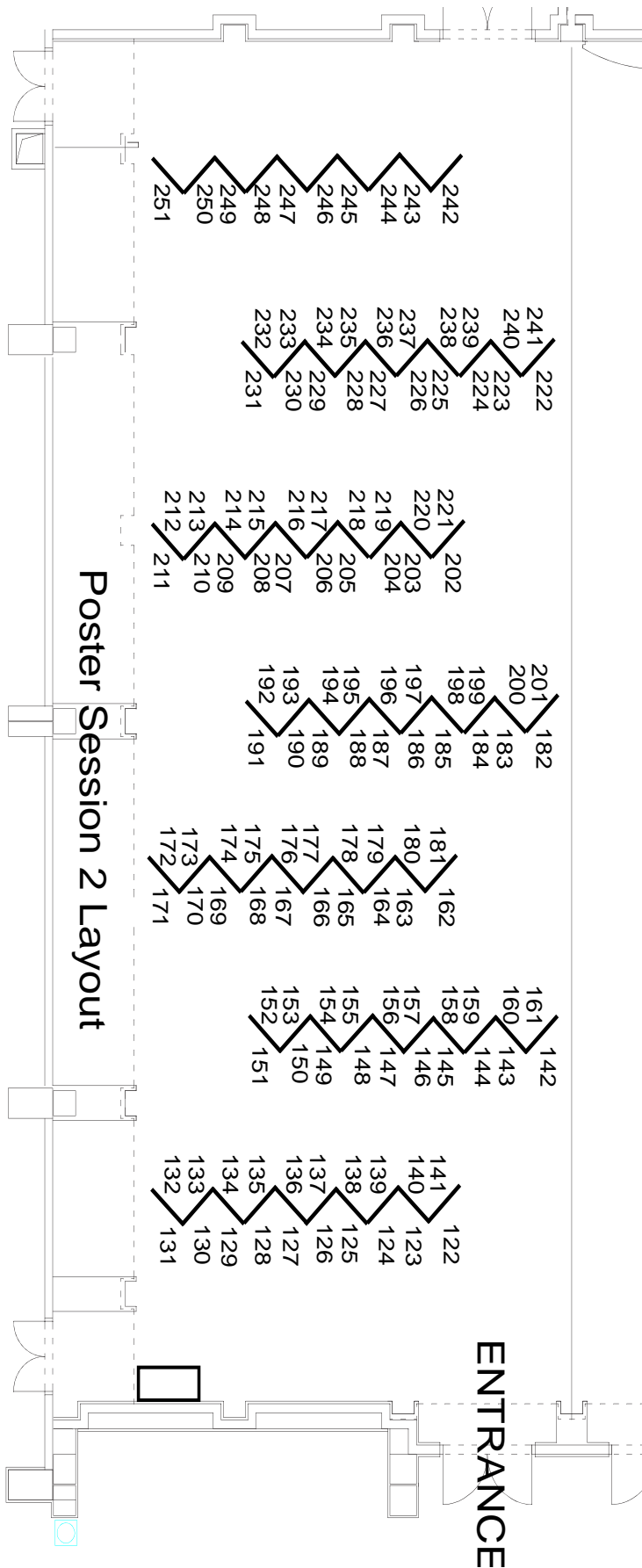

With the advent of the feminist movement of the late 1960s and early 1970s, scientists in nursing and other fields embraced new frameworks for studying gender as well as new methodologies for investigating women's health. Within the nursing discipline, investigators redefined women's health from "gynecology" to "gyn-ecology", emphasizing the importance of understanding the context in which women lived their lives as foundational to an understanding of their health. In addition, investigators incorporated feminist theory and methodologies into their work, putting women at the center of investigations and seeking understanding of women's own perspectives on their health. Recent evaluations of the impact of women's health research indicate areas of progress as well as challenges remaining for the future. Studies focusing on the menopausal transition will be used as exemplars to illustrate the relationship between transformations in methodologies and scientific approaches to understanding women's health, relationships of women's health to the sociopolitical context of women's lives, and changing science policy. Adjusting the lenses through which we view women's health by viewing women's health problems from the perspectives of multiple disciplines prompts a continuing critical review of scientific progress and proposals to address future challenges in women's health research.</p>
